While he was there, he became interested in football and decided to be a team manager. It was on the sidelines and in the huddle that Coach Dan Ritter realized the determination and talent of Matty Mont. Matty had some intellectual challenges, but everyone who met him quickly realized his **ABILITIES** far overshadowed any disABILITY there might be. In 2007, Coach Ritter was chosen as Head Blue

Coach for the DFRC Blue-Gold All★Star Football Game. As he prepared for training camp and the game, he very quickly realized he would need his man-on-the-spot who had helped carry their team through the season. Since Matty was always there with water, towels, a pat on the back, or whatever the Wildcats needed, Coach knew he needed Matty for the All★Star Game. Matty was a manager for the Blue team and he spent the entire week at camp on the University of Delaware campus, working every practice and making sure everything was ready for the next one. The time he spent getting to know the players and coaches gave Matty the greatest memories of that week. Not only did he love his experience, but everyone with whom he came in contact realized the treasure he was and many of them have stayed in touch all these years later. Matty Mont has returned to DFRC training camp as a manager for at least part of every week since that first and he looks forward to it every year. He was such an asset to the group, then Executive Director Dr. Tony Glenn asked



Matty if he'd be willing to share his knowledge of the game and join DFRC's Athletic Committee. In this role he has served for the past ten years, Matty is an integral part as planning and decisions are made for training camp and the game. He has also become the featured dinner speaker during one night of camp. When Matty speaks, the room falls silent, everyone knowing a valuable message is about to be delivered.

After graduating from high school, Matty put his culinary skills to work at Waggies by Maggie & Friends, a non-profit dog treat company whose mission is to employ persons with intellectual disABILITIES. Waggies brings great pride to DFRC as one of the beneficiaries of funding DFRC distributes. Matty is the Head Chef, charged with

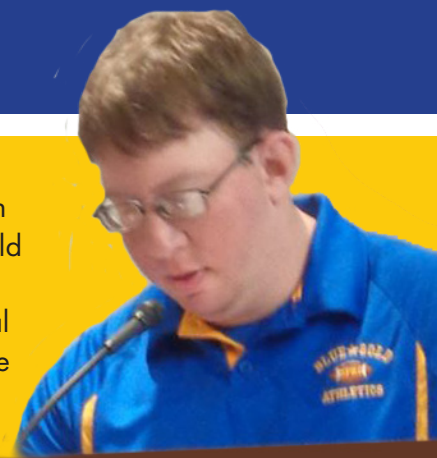
mixing all the ingredients for these very special dog treats. He loves going to work every day and his parents are very proud of all he is doing.

In 2001, Tony was named Executive Director of DFRC. 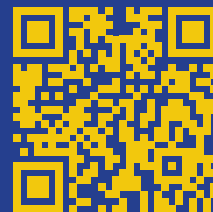

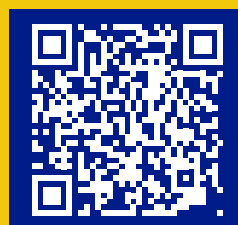
