Since Matty was always there with water, towels, a pat on the back, or whatever the Wildcats needed, Coach knew he needed Matty for the All★Star Game. Matty was a manager for the Blue team and he spent the entire week at camp on the University of Delaware campus, working every practice and making sure everything was ready for the next one. The time he spent getting to know the players and coaches gave Matty the greatest memories of that week. Not only did he love his experience, but everyone with whom he came in contact realized the treasure he was and many of them have stayed in touch all these years later. Matty Mont has returned to DFRC training camp as a manager for at least part of every week since that first and he looks forward to it every year. He was such an asset to the group, then Executive

Matty if he'd be willing to share his knowledge of the game and join DFRC's Athletic Committee. In this role he has served for the past ten years, Matty is an integral part as planning and decisions are made for training camp and the game. Robert Ruliph Morgan Carpenter, III "Ruly"



Ruly devoted himself to numerous causes and achieved many significant feats during his 81 years, but his family and friends always took top priority.

He was that genuinely wonderful *Man of Action* who took his commitments seriously and moved forward with utmost determination. When we reflect upon Ruly, thoughts of honesty, integrity, humility and morality flood the mind. Ruly Carpenter was a man of his word. He listened intently and reacted with fairness and truth. If Ruly encountered a wrong, he acted with strong conviction to make it right. Injustice was never tolerated.

worked his way through the ranks of the DFRC Blue-Gold Football Committee and the Board of Trustees as a volunteer for 28 years, serving on every committee, in every role. Whether serving as Game Chairperson in 1988 or President of the Board of Trustees, Tony made it his mission to ensure that DFRC continually focused on actively spreading awareness and celebrating the ABILITIES of all individuals throughout the state of Delaware.

In 2001, Tony was named Executive Director of DFRC. During the past 21 years with Tony at the helm, he has led the foundation through every charge, challenging the DFRC family to discover unique strengths and talents and join together to deepen our mission and attain excellence in every aspect. We've all benefited from his many "what if" lists, as he guided us through each step of the journey. In addition, numerous organizations throughout the state have benefited from Tony's leadership in bringing
